



GCCF awarded \$82,852 during its Spring 2025 grant cycle.

We thank all applicants for their time in applying.

- Office of Human Services received \$9,000 to help with the nearly 300% increase in households served by the food pantry that they have experienced in the last year.
- Ashley Community Schools received \$237.27 for the Ashley Community Days project;
- Alma Police Department/City of Alma received \$12,000 to enhance and streamline communication and collaboration between law enforcement agencies within Gratiot County;
- City of Ithaca received \$5,373 for radar feedback signs to alert motorists of their current speed to help slow down traffic for children walking across Pine River Street to and from school;
- Mid-Michigan District Health Department received \$5,000 to provide Gratiot County youth and families with access to health and safety services for the back-to-school season;
- Gratiot Integrated Health Network received \$2,500 to provide the Gratiot County community with training in suicide first aid through the Community Applied Suicide Intervention and Skills Training (ASIST) program;
- Alma Little League received \$7,500 to restore, fix, and update Euclid Baseball Fields and Washington Softball Field;
- Gratiot County Sheriff's Office received \$6,000 to provide the youth of Gratiot County with an understanding of police work through the 2025 Youth Police Academy;
- St. Louis Public Schools received \$5,000 to help fund Festival of Steel 2025: 25 years of Steelpan in Gratiot County to assist in providing world-class music instruction and performance opportunities to students and residents of Gratiot County;
- Women's Resource Center of MidMichigan received \$16,200 to renovate the building and grounds of the Career, Prom, and Homecoming Closets;
